I am excited to report that our 2021 Jr/Yr Summer Intensive was a huge success!! We had a waitlist of 2 riders this year which we needed to pull both in due to scratches. We ended up with 12 riders (only 6 were my students) and 13 horses!! The riders were mostly from Colorado, but we had 1 rider from North Carolina and 1 rider from New Mexico.

I reformatted the schedule this year to emulate the D4K (Dressage for Kids) Winter Intensive Training that Lendon Gray puts on in Florida every Jan-Mar. Two of our riders this year had also gone to the WIT program which is why I made the changes that I did.

We ended up with Gigi Brittain on Thursday, Petra Warlimont on Friday, and Jessica Greer on Saturday. We had assigned scribes to stand with the clinician to take notes of the lesson. The other riders were required to watch all the lessons and take notes for themselves. The feedback that I have received so far has been really positive.

Day 1: Thursday

Gigi Brittain taught private and semi-private lessons. Kim Cavanagh gave a presentation about Rider Symmetry at lunch. Sophia Still and Charlotte Feddersen did a presentation about their experiences at WIT after dinner. Then we played around in the “sandbox” with the girls doing various dressage tests on foot, including the GP Special in a quadrille formation!! Then they tried their “hands” at jumping the x-country courses. We have learned that this is the best way to get them all to sleep on the first night...lol!!

Day 2: Friday

Petra Warlimont taught 13 private lessons starting at 7am!!

This night we had a BBQ and invited the parents to a presentation from Joan Clay regarding the NAYC program. Paige Smith and Raissa Chunko brought their horses down in the pouring rain to give a demonstration of what the future might look like. Paige did very well ridden and quite strategic PSG test in our indoor which is 30x50!! Raissa did a long lining/in hand demonstration to show that horses can do so much more than be ridden. They both were amazing during the Q&A sessions after their demonstrations. Afterwards Raissa gave a very professional presentation about her trip to Aachen, Germany. Joan Clay then gave a presentation and Q&A regarding the NAYC program.

Over the past 3 SI “camps” I have included a clinician who was either one the NAJYRC team, coached a student to the team, or is involved with the team. We had each of them do a presentation/Q&A for the riders at lunch but, like permission slips, the information doesn't always make it home to the parents?!?! I felt that this route was

MUCH more successful as it brought the parents in to get the massive amount of information needed to support the goals of their children. I plan to continue this in future SI camps.

#### Day 3: Saturday

Jessica Greer had been contracted to do a Ride-A-Test. Unfortunately, the weather did not agree with my plans. She graciously ended up giving 12 private lessons to the riders.

Some of the feedback that I received from the riders was that they felt that the clinicians were in a perfect order. Gigi pinpointed issues, Petra worked them through said issues, and Jessica brought it all together.

#### Volunteer Time:

I want to be sure that volunteer time is given to Joan Clay, Raissa Chunko, and Paige Smith for the Friday night demos and presentations. Also, Gretchen Begg volunteered her time to help wherever needed throughout all 3 days.

#### Scholarship/Grant requirements:

Sophia Still has completed her requirement to Foothills by presenting her experience at WIT and writing an article for the Centaur.

I have forgotten if Raissa was supposed to present her trip to Aachen to the SI camp but just in case she has fulfilled this.

#### Financial Stuff:

Original net profit was \$1725.88 then Gigi donated her fee of \$600 to the program so we ended up with a profit of \$2325.88!!!

Personally, I feel like this program is starting to become what I had envisioned since I became the RMDS Jr/Yr Chairperson. We may even need audition tapes next year!!

On June 7, 2021, we hosted a great Zoom program about "What to Put in Your First Aid Kit for Shows," with Dr. Bruce Connolly, DVM. Bruce included a great handout that summarized the program and provided a check list for horse exhibitors of items to always have with you in your horse trailer, plus other vital information. With Bruce's permission, we plan to make copies available in the Show Office for our July-August show at the Boulder County Fairgrounds in Longmont.

A week later, we held our regular monthly board meeting via Zoom, and covered routine business. We have received a nice sponsorship for our High Point winners in this month's show from Colorado Tack and Supply in Thornton: embroidered or engraved show pads or bridles. The final determination will be made by the owner this month. We also received confirmation that Mike Maroone Ford (formerly Longmont Ford) will be providing new pickups on loan for the use of the judges and scribes at the July show. Later, Miranda Avila reported that her company had donated thirty clip on, reel-type badge holders for our volunteers at the show, another generous contribution.

On July 9, our Show Committee met to make final plans for the July 31-August 1 show at the Fairgrounds. Heather Petersen, Show Secretary, joined us for the meeting and let us know we have 100 horses registered for each of the two days! Nicole Donohue, Show Manager, reported she had confirmation that the Fairgrounds can provide us with

additional warm-up space, which will allow us to build two temporary arenas in the large Jack Murphy Arena in front of the grandstand. That will permit us to run two rings simultaneously and keep the schedule doable for such a large field. We discussed many other details, but our decision to go ahead with the cost of \$660 dollars for the additional space will be more than offset by the large number of participants. We will be abiding by USEF and Colorado protocols for COVID-19, and will require waivers before people can obtain a wrist band allowing them to enter the competition area.

The success of the recognized shows at Nighthawk Equestrian Center, Longmont, plus the BVDA Fairgrounds show means we have recovered following the worst of the COVID-10 pandemic. We wish all RMDS GMOs and all our members and horses a bill of good health for the balance of 2021!

Our Board would like to encourage members to volunteer for Nighthawk shows and other shows within RMDS's geographic bounds. Volunteers are our life blood! For those who've done so, thanks for your service.

### **3. Foothills**

We had a successful RAT on June 5<sup>th</sup> and a full show on June 6<sup>th</sup>. We are looking forward to another full show in August.

We plan to start hosting our "Foothills Firsts" monthly clinic series starting in October. Our goal is to provide a monthly opportunity to ride with top trainers, local at first, until we can bring in clinicians from around the country to educate our membership. We may explore grant opportunities in the future, but for now, we are thinking local to build up the clinic series' publicity.

Another exciting addition to the Foothills calendar is our first Foothills Dressage Festival. A level 2 USEF show tentatively scheduled for July 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> 2022. We are awaiting USEF approval and confirmation of a second judge. We have accepted Laura Quackenbush's resignation as Foothills Chapter Treasurer after many years of service. Nadia Westra was nominated to fill the position and unanimously voted into office during our July 12, 2021 Special Board Meeting.

GVDS hosted a sold-out schooling show on June 4 and a nearly sold-out recognized show on June 5-6. Melissa Creswick judged the schooling and recognized show. Sharron Sarchet joined Melissa for the second day, creating a surprise panel for the exhibitors. Debbie Moloznick was the TD. Both Debbie and Melissa gave us some great feedback, most of which will be implemented for future shows. We did a post-show survey for exhibitors, again gleaning some excellent ideas. It is from this feedback that we decided that in 2022, we will hold two shows rather than just one show. We also debuted our new Premier dressage arena! We were thankful for the covered warm-up and show arena, the misters and the fans, to keep our horses and riders cool on a hot weekend. And our decision to begin each day with the national anthem was a hit with our exhibitors and officials. We are working toward having a flag presentation in the future.

We had a member sponsored clinic with Sue Martin and are planning for our Jennifer Roth clinic in August, a USDF/GVDS sponsored clinic. Dr. Susan Schneider is graciously donating her Montrose facility for the Jennifer Roth clinic. All riding spots are filled, but space is available for auditors.

**BOARD OF DIRECTORS:** The Board of Directors Best Practices Manual is finalized. We follow RMDS By-Laws, however, this Best Practices Manual contains information for operational and procedural guidelines for the Board for matters such as: Quorum and voting; Nominating and interviewing new Board members; Committees; Accounting best practices; Accounting and non-profit record keeping; Fiscal decision and ratification; Annual Business Plan ratification; Annual Program management; Annual Donor and Sponsor Development Plan; and Annual Event Planning. The Board will retain its Pro Bono attorney for 2022 for assistance with contracts and other operations.

**2022 DRESSAGE SHOW MANAGEMENT:** The Board of Directors accepted three bids for show secretary and two bids for show management for 2022. Susan Peacock at showsecretary.com was chosen for the 2022 season. Jay Chabucos was chosen for show management for 2022. The Board also continued in its retention of Clayton McElvain of CM Footing to consult on footing and arena design at HIPICO for the remainder of the 2021 and for all of the 2022 show season. The Board is also continuing its use of an expert advisory group for consulting on show and special event matters for 2021 and 2022.

**FUNDRAISING :** NMD-RMDS Board of Directors currently has a fundraising goal of \$25,000.00 by 1 August to support the 16-19 September 2021 Great American Insurance Group/United States Dressage Federation Region 5 Dressage Championships and Open Show. NMD-RMDS is the Presenting USEF/USDF Licensee.

**MAY SHOW REPORT:** NMD-RMDS had a full, 2-Ring show at HIPICO Santa Fe on 15 and 16 May. Revenue from the show was 20% over our projected goal. All proceeds from the May show are earmarked for the Region 5 Championship and Open Show and NMD-RMDS Year End Awards.

**GMO MEMBER RECRUITING & RETENTION:** NMD-RMDS continues with its monthly membership drive activities.

**SPONSORS:** The Show Committee is continuing to reach out to potential sponsors for the upcoming Region 5 Championships and Open Show. Sponsorship and fundraising campaign for October shows are underway.

**VOLUNTEER PROGRAM:** NMD-RMDS has had an overwhelming response to its Call for Show Volunteers campaign. As a Thank You to each of our Volunteers at our 2021 shows, NMD-RMDS gives out a gift bag with donated items.

**JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDER PROGRAM:** NMD-RMDS offers scholarships and grants to age-qualified riders based on USDF/USEF guidelines. Funds for the 2021 JR/YR Program have been donated by the Jack Kagan Foundation and the Hell Canyon Farm Young Rider Fund. A written application and interview with applicant and parent(s)/guardian are required. Beneficiaries must report on their use of the funds and update their application for each subsequent year if they wish to reapply. Funds and opportunity awards are based on need. Scholarships are for education-based and mentorship opportunities (Mentors must be USEF Safe Sport trained and approved). Grants are for competition opportunities.

**YEAR END AWARDS:** NMD-RMDS finalized its 2021 Year End Award Program and will start announcing the qualification requirements in July. There are many great categories in which an NMD-RMDS member may win great prizes, trophies, recognition and more! Our Volunteer awards include categories that acknowledge all our fabulous volunteers for 2021 – both members and non-members.

#### **EDUCATION:**

NMD-RMDS' HOOF IT UP! University for members is available. Members earn credits for online learning through USDF; Dressage Today; Independent Online Trainers; Riding and Auditing approved clinics; earning USDF Bronze, Silver or Gold medals; NMD-RMDS Volunteer opportunities; and other approved independent online and in-person education. There will be year-end awards for credit levels and demonstrated proficiency in areas of dressage training, competing, horsemanship, management, health care and nutrition.

A working group is submitting grant applications for a 2022 3-day Symposium with a working title of *Biomechanics and Collection*. A panel of an USDF certified trainer and an internationally recognized biomechanical/locomotion expert will work with riders and horses in clinic riding setting, as well as discuss off-site presentations, on how to evaluate and solve training issues that keep a horse and rider from progressing up the levels. Auditors are welcome and NMD-RMDS members receive HOOF IT UP! University credits.
