Warm-up arena Attendant

Before beginning as Warm-up arena Attendant

- 1. Make sure you have the following items:
 - A show schedule (showing all ride times) on a clipboard.
 - A pen or pencil.
 - A walkie-talkie.
 - A watch or clock set to official show time.
- 2. Ask show management about warm-up arena rules. Where is lunging allowed? What is the maximum number of horses allowed in the warm-up arena?

Procedures for Warm-up arena Attendant

- 1. As the riders enter the warm-up arena, check them off on your schedule so you know who's in the arena.
- 2. Listen to the Gatekeeper. He/she will tell you which horse is currently in the competition arena so you can know when to send the next rider to the competition arena.
- 3. It's NOT your responsibility to search for riders. However, let the Gatekeeper and Show Management know if a rider has not appeared prior to the assigned ride time.
- 4. Announce to riders (usually by number and/or name) when they should go to the competition arena.
- 5. Make sure there are not more riders than can safely warm up in the arena and that everyone is wearing helmets and observing safe, appropriate behavior.

Behavior guidelines for Warm-up arena Attendants

- 1. Communication over the walkie-talkie should be kept to a minimum.
- 2. Use tact when speaking to riders.
- 3. Be supportive and courteous.
- 4. Make NO remarks about any horse or rider in the competition, including but not limited to, any background information about any horse or rider, their trainer, etc.
