
Could use the camp as a goal for the end of the camp. Kathy Simard is going to help Cassandra.

We had great interaction and discussions at the Region 5 meetings and a couple of very nice tables for the awards dinner. I was so happy to have my daughter join me for a couple of days for her first USDF convention.

The USDF Convention is always a great chance for networking, catching up with old friends and participating in the governance of our great sport. Our regional meetings went well and a lot of information was exchanged, including the discussion of a possible western venue for the US Dressage Finals which will be visited soon to check on feasibility.
