- The show was at Table Mountain Ranch beginning at 8:00 am and ending about 12:30 pm followed by an awards program. Anclaire Spaulding gathered some wonderful prizes for the event this year.
- RMDS provided ribbons through 8 placings and USDF provided medals through 6 placings for both youth and adults teams.
- Volunteers came to the rescue and we ended up having more than enough.
- Plans are already under way for next year!!
- Anclaire found several places that donated awesome prizes!!
- Cassandra and her crew at Table Mountain did a fabulous job getting the facility ready. Everything was outside by the arenas.
- Discussion of contacting Western Dressage for ribbons/medals for western dressage teams Simone Windeler will help take care of this for next year.

Estimated Cost: \$2750 (her fee is ~\$1750 and I'm estimating ~\$1,000 in fees).

In order to help pay for the clinic, we would like to do a 'drawing' at Championships. 1st prize is "Win a ride with Olympic Irish rider Judy Reynolds" and the 2nd prize is 1 of the VIP seats given to RMDS by CHP for the Team Championship Show that we did not use.

We need board approval to use 1 of the VIP tickets to help offset the cost of the AA clinic. The other 2 tickets will be used for the silent auction at Year End Awards.

There was a lot of discussion regarding the use of the VIP ticket and concern that Championships is behind in sponsorship commitments. It was also discussed that the clinic has not yet been approved or even confirmed so several folks the VIP package "drawing" or auction at Championships should go to help fund championships.

As for the clinic, much discussion was had regarding budgeting, set up, expenses, and logistics. The expenses listed are not complete and there was a lot of concern that the expenses would be significant for a clinician like this and that it would not really target the Adult Amateur competitors in our area.

Kathy Simard proposed the clinic go back for more complete budgeting and clinician consideration. 2nd by Beverly Swanson. The motion passed unanimously.

Beverly Swanson proposed that the 3 remaining VIP DSIR packages be used in the following ways:

- 1 Championships fundraising to support Championships
- 2 Silent auction at awards banquet to fund the awards banquet
- 3 Live or silent auction at awards banquet to support the AA clinic if the clinic has approval by the time of the awards banquet.

2nd by Didi DeKrey. The motion passed unanimously.





- Suggestion of using the \$350 profit for an ice cream social at championships.



Boulder Valley Dressage Demonstration and Meeting Monday, August 14 at 6:30 p.m. Blue Roof Equestrian Center 10951 Isabelle Road Lafayette, CO 80026

Demonstration - Correct and Incorrect movements: The movements in dressage all have a purpose. They are there to help improve the horse's suppleness, his balance and his reaction to your aids. The movements can also help you discover where your horse needs a bit more work. If you have a problem in a movement, you, the rider, being the smarter of the two in the partnership, needs to figure out which aid is not working for you. Vanessa Chavez, Silver Medalists and trainer at Blue Roof Equestrian Center will moderate as a rider demonstrates both correct and

incorrect movements and how to change your aids for more success! Snacks will be served! We will have a brief meeting after the demonstration!
