Permanent Committee Reports Continued:

Adult Amateur

AA clinic with GW is upon us - April 4th and 5th. We have 10 riders and 2 alternates. So far, we have about ~25 auditors. I will have chairs for auditors. Auditors need to bring a sack lunch. Michelle will order lunches for the riders and George.

The group on the western slope wants us to consider giving 1 spot away to them at the next clinic because they have very few events on that side of the mountains. I said I would bring it forth to the board.

Discussion of how the coronavirus will affect the clinic. We are less than the 50 CDC maximum gathering recommendation, so we will proceed. Refunds will be considered on an individual.

Natalie DeFee Mendik is going to coordinate an article on how to improve the quality of the application videos so that our folks can be a bit more educated in their applications in the future.

1. Corrections to FEI and Training Level for 2019 season

- a. Trophy plates have been corrected and will be placed on the trophies when they are returned.
- b. New ribbons, 5x7 plaques were ordered and mailed.

- c. Cost of the corrections, including the ribbons and plaques as well as postage to mail them all out (did not request reimbursement) is approximately \$600, which will put us over budget.
- 2. New Intro Level Trophies
 - a. As discussed and voted in January, we will add an Intro Level to Junior/Young Rider, AA, Pony, and Open Divisions.
 - b. Have sponsor for AA division, please consider sponsoring one of the other divisions whether by your chapter or with a friend or two. If no sponsor is found, we will provide a ribbon and plaque but will not purchase trophies through RMDS. Trophies generally cost \$200-\$350 when the perpetual plaque cost is included, so an additional \$1000 to the Awards budget is too big of a hit at this time.
- 3. Awards criteria for database set up
 - a. Made some edits to clarify Intro, what is included with riders with multiple levels or multiple horses.

Arabian Award – keep it purebred, or change it to a ½ Arabian and full Arabian award. **MaryJo Hoepner moved we change the award to ½ Arabian and purebred Arabian combined, 2nd by Pam Phillips. Motion passed unanimously.** Friesian Award – keep it purebred or change it to cross and purebred? It was decided that if someone would like to sponsor it, we will create a Friesian Sport Horse award. We will then determine which breed registries will be included in the award.

CodeGeek

- **In progress:** Ron & Megan continue to work on writing up the detailed outline of required functionality to be built. We've completed the scope for the website and content management system, the member

sign up forms, and the member and horse back-end management. We're making good progress in scoping the Scores, Awards, and Reporting functionality.

- **In progress:** The CodeGeek team of Ron, Megan (Project Manager), Isaiah (Lead Developer) and David (Developer) are wrapping up the planning phases and architecture phases for the membership signup and management sections.
- **In progress (new):** The programming team has started writing code based on the wireframes we've shown you.
- **In progress (new):** The Designer has given us initial designs for the website homepage and we've provided her with internal feedback. We're expecting to see a new round of designs early next week.
 - CodeGeek will continue to schedule meetings to review the wireframes and designs with the RMDS team.

RMDS

- We are just about ready to share some initial design ideas with your team, so we'll need to get something on the schedule soon.
- We will likely need continued demos and Q&A sessions surrounding the scores and awards portion of the app as we move forward.

Timeline notes

Fundraising efforts are once under way for the USDF Region 5 Juniors and Young Riders as they try to qualify and travel to the 2020 FEI North American Youth Championships. The Championships will be held August 4- 9, 2020 at the Great Lakes Equestrian Festival in Traverse City, Michigan. It is going to require a tremendous amount of funding to send our teams though thankfully the distance will enable us to drive the horses. We hope we will be able to send a 8 riders with their horses, grooms and Chef d'Equipes. In addition to the transportation to the show, there are the expenses of hotel, team uniforms, chef expenses, feed, bedding and oh so much more that they need help with. If you are interested in competing in NAYC, the application and fee should be turned in to the USDF office by March 17, 2020 in order to avoid stiffer fees. If you apply by March 17th, the fee is only \$50. Applications submitted between March 18th and April 28th are \$100 and the final application deadline is May 12th, but it will cost you \$300 to apply between April 29th and May 12th. Absolutely no applications will be accepted after May 12th.

Regional Championship bids for 2021 have been received and we should know soon where the competition will be held. We have a great committee from our USDF governance representatives that are reviewing the bids and giving their feedback to the USDF site selection committee. USDF will announce the locations of the 2021 Regionals in May.

- Overlap of judges/clinicians. FUNDRAISING:

NMD-RMDS Board of Directors, Advisory Board and Members are currently fundraising for the upcoming 25 April USDF Schooling Show and the 9-10 May NMD-RMDS Swing Into Spring! I and II Shows. Sponsors pledged to date total \$1,855.00 in dollar donations. Approximately \$1,000.00 of in-kind services and goods donations have been pledged.

EDUCATION:

Hell Canyon Farm presents four annual clinics with Jeremy Steinberg at Hipico Santa Fe. HCF donates auditor proceeds to NMD-RMDS. Auditor fees are \$20 for a 1-Day Pass and \$30 for a 2-Day Pass. Jeremy's 2020 dates are:

NMD-RMDS is currently working on the budget, grant applications and faculty for a USDF/TDF 3-Day Symposium in the Spring 2021.

NMD-RMDS has three USDF Schooling Shows for 2020:

NMD-RMDS has four USDF Recognized Shows for 2020:

- 9-10 May 2020 – NMD-RMDS Swing Into Spring! I and II, Hipico Santa Fe
- 17-18 October 2020 – NMD-RMDS Fall Flaunt It! I and II, Hipico Santa Fe

NMD-RMDS is currently working with Hipico Santa Fe and 2 White Feet to possibly host and support the 2020 USDF Region 5 Championship, if approved to make the move to Santa Fe. Advance planning, budgeting and contracts are being discussed in anticipation of a decision to hold the event at Hipico Santa Fe.

NMD-RMDS; Hipico Santa Fe; and 2 White Feet, Inc., have submitted a bid for the 2021 USDF Region 5 Championships.

VOLUNTEERS:

NMD-RMDS currently has a volunteer network of 14 committed, energetic volunteers for education events and shows. We are seeking to grow this network to 20 before the May 2020 shows.

YEAR END AWARDS:
